


## Snapshot of the Digital ORICL Tool

The ORICL tool has 117 questions across six domains – ID identity, sense of self; CON connectedness to others; EMO emotional wellbeing; PH physical learning and wellbeing; CK constructing knowledge; CO communication – that are aligned with the EYLF (V2.0).

The ORICL questions ask you to rate what you observe about the child's experiences, actions, and interactions, as well as the responses of peers and educators to the child. Most questions have examples to guide you in your choice of response. You simply click on the most appropriate rating.



For each question you are also able to add photos and your observations, from short jottings to longer formal observations. These are automatically date-stamped.



The Navigation and Summary bar allows you to move from one set of questions to another. The ticks automatically show which question pages you have already completed.

## Examples of questions from the Digital ORICL Tool

Questions are colour-coded to provide clarity: Questions about the child are in black font, questions about the educator are in blue font, and questions about the child's peers are in green font as shown in the examples below.

Domain 1: Identity, Belonging, Sense of Self, Family and Culture
ID17 When in their usual group, this child's peers engage in similar activities and routines at the same time as the child.
<b>②</b> (e.g., they eat together)

<b>Domain 2: Connectedness with Others</b> CON03 This child approaches and joins in when a group of children is forming or interacting around a meal table, an educator or an activity.
(e.g., playful interactions at meal table, reading with educator, sand play, climbing, pretend play)

Domain 3A: Emotional Wellbeing  EM14 When this child is expressing emotions (facial expression, bodily movement, actions), educators use words with this child to describe the child's feelings.  Not Yet  Rarely  Sometimes  Often  Always  Skip for now
Domain 3B: Physical Wellbeing  PH07 When this child indicates an interest in engaging in active large motor arm and/or leg movement play, educators join in to encourage participation or teach a skill.  (e.g., plays rolling, throwing, catching game, models hammering)  Not Yet  Rarely  Sometimes  Often  Always  No opportunity to observe
Domain 4: Constructing Knowledge and Understandings  CK11 This child's efforts to engage with their environment (materials, activities, educators, and peers) show increasingly coordinated goal-oriented behaviours and skills mastery.
(e.g., reaches for, grasps, and pulls out a partially hidden toy, stands on something to reach an object, undoes and does up buttons and shoes, turns switches on and off, says "I did it")

<b>Domain 5: Communication</b> CO02 When educators communicate verbally or nonverbally with this child, he/she listens and responds by communicating or collaborating.
• (e.g., child looks into educator's eyes, points or gestures, vocalises, babbles, talks, uses signs, moves closer or reaches, shows object, directs expression of emotion)
